It's as easy as a direct deduction from your salary. How much you donate is entirely up to you and all donations above \$2 per pay period are completely tax free.

What are the benefits of Workplace Giving?

- An easy and convenient way to donate on a regular basis from your pay, receiving an immediate tax deduction for donations of \$2.00 or more per pay period.
- No need to keep receipts.

How does it work?

The chosen donation amount is deducted from your pay before tax. This means that you receive the tax benefit straight away.

For someone earning between \$45,001 and \$120,000 per year, the benefits are as follows:

If you donate	It will cost you approx.	Breast Cancer Care WA receives	If your employer matches your donation
\$10	\$6.55	\$10	\$20
\$20	\$13.10	\$20	\$40
\$30	\$19.65	\$30	\$60
